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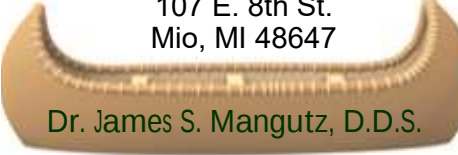

Bereavement



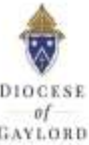

We have \$150,109.06 in our account towards our final goal of \$210,000.00.

Last weekend was Triumph of the Cross, which means a lot of busses coming to our Shrine, not counting people who visit on their own. Each bus spent between 1 to 3 hours at our shrine. We had 4 busses on Saturday, another 8 busses on Sunday and one on Monday. Each bus has 50-55 people. You can do the math. Keep in mind that this was Saturday/Sunday along with our weekend Masses.

This whole process starts with the organization and coordination from the office starting with Maryanne taking the phone calls. She then relays the information to Monte who coordinates with each group their needs. Then the information is put on paper where Monte and Kelly H. coordinate workers. This is not a simple process and takes many people to come together.

This amount of people coming to our Shrine presents many issues for our small parish. As usual, the parish family rose to the occasion and with precision accuracy accomplished this work of love, probably to the best of any time in our recent history. The volunteers gave up their weekend to do this work and were at the Shrine from 8:00 am to 8:30 pm on Saturday, and again until 3:30 pm on Sunday. The bus on Monday from Canada wanted a chicken dinner and their request was filled by the same volunteers.

Incidentally, Father San did the weekend Masses and was present for every bus as well hearing confessions.

The Gift Shop had its slew of volunteers, coordinated by Cathy Kuba who spent the weekend at Mio Motel because of the distance to her home. Her workers were Marcia Carr, Suzanne Petre, Diane Denise and Karen Thompson.

God blessed this weekend of love by giving us two quality, warm, sunny days that allowed the visitors to meander the grounds outside and use outside tables, relieving the pressure of having them all in the Parish hall.

As our events are getting bigger and the amount of tours are increasing, our volunteers are a God-send. The volunteers executed with precise precision all of their jobs. Some of the visitors state that we are their favorite shrine to visit. Thank You God, because this does not work without your help.
