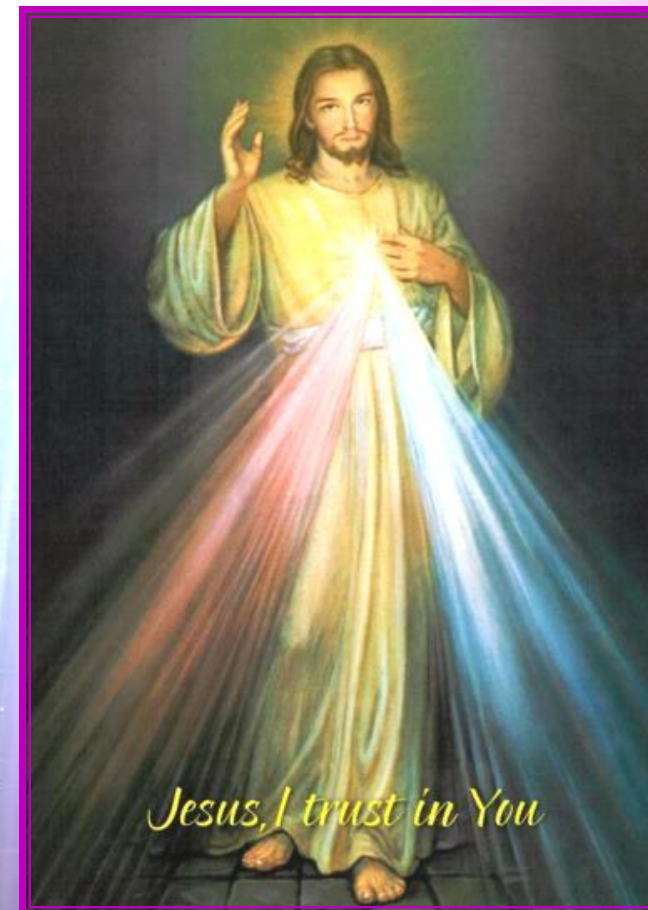

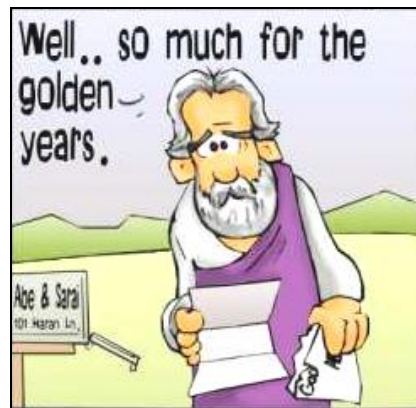
Saint Bernadette Soubirous Feast Day April 16

As a child in a poor French family in the Hautes-Pyrenees town of Lourdes, Bernadette was the eldest of 9 children. Born on January 7, 1844, Bernadette suffered both asthma and cholera. Her poor health was possibly why she was only 4'7" tall.

Contrary to a belief popularized by Hollywood films, Bernadette learned very little French, only studying French in school after age 13. Uneducated, she had not made her first Communion by 1858. That was the year she experienced 18 visions of a beautiful lady calling herself the Immaculate Conception and calling for penance and pilgrimage.

Some of the people who interviewed Bernadette after her revelation of the visions thought her simple-minded. However, despite being rigorously interviewed by officials of both the Catholic Church and the French government, she stuck consistently to her story. After investigation, Catholic Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions in 1862.

Bernadette was unchanged by this extraordinary experience, and in 1866 became a member of the Sisters of Charity, taking the name Maria-Bernarda. Chronically ill after 1875 with asthma and tuberculosis of the bones, she died at age 35. When she was canonized in 1933, it was not for being the Lourdes visionary, but for her simple life of prayer, devotion and obedience.



And so, at age 75, Abraham receives word from the "Boss" that retirement will be delayed.
