SHRINE CORNER

Three weeks ago, Skip Bohlinger addressed the Parish on the financial picture of the Church. There was good news and bad news.

Offertory collections were up, but cost of doing business has gone up as well, namely insurance being a major cost item. In addition, there were some unexpected expenses such as city water hookup.

Two weeks ago Monte Mariani spoke to the Parish on the upcoming final restoration project, the patio flooring and the cost to complete this project totaled \$210,000. Jim Supina is in charge of making this come to fruition.

Recently, we were advised that CSA had exceeded the amount that needed to be collected. Now all additional income from CSA will come back to the Parish. Every year since I have been here, the Parish has surpassed the amount requested.

August 9th a bus from Windsor came for Mass and a tour. Their priest had an emergency and did not come so Father San substituted. This was a busload of highly-educated Chaldeans from Windsor. Nancy R. and Lanna did the kitchen. At Mass, Arabic was provided for the readings and one of the young visitors did the English readings. They had another young lady who played the organ. I told her she could stay, but she was studying to be an attorney.

We just finished the Feast of Assumption activities with Bishop Walsh celebrating the Mass and leading the Stations. It takes a lot of effort to make the details of this work. At the set-up meeting, Annette and Delores did the planning and got it done—expertly.

I am going to end with a Skip B. line, since he has been a member during the reign of 8 parish priests: *“Everything that has been done, has been done without debt.”* When you consider the size of the Parish and it being very seasonable with attendance, this is truly a great Parish.
