



Svnthesis **Report from All Diocese** of Gaylord Questionnaires

- There are 75 parishes in our Diocese.
- There are 16 schools in our Diocese. \Diamond
- \diamond There are 48 clergy in our Diocese.

A Synopsis of the Questionnaire Results:

- 1) There is a very real disconnect between Church life and "real" life.
- 2) There is a great deal of woundedness and there are not many mental health resources.
- 3) There is the feeling there is much confusion about what the Church actually teaches and there appears to be confusion even among bishops.
- 4) Catholic doctrine is often opposed to prevailing norms in society but the Church does not do a good of explaining why.
- 5) There is a strong desire for sacramental catechesis.
- 6) The Catholic Church is perceived as a collection of rules with a style of worship that is distant.
- 7) There is an overwhelmingly aging population and young families do not feel welcome nor encouraged to join groups and to instead keep things status quo.
- 8) There are many long-term care facilities that rarely, if ever, see a priest to receive the sacraments.
- 9) It is difficult to know what is happening, even in one's own parish.
- 10) The homily is a very important part of Mass and there is the desire to relate the readings to daily life.

The past few weeks have been busy for the parish and the Shrine. The 11 Chaldean busses came in force last week. Debbie Banks, our new kitchen coordina-



tor, kept busy with all the tea and coffee as well as treats. I also wish to personally say thank you to the many volunteers who so generously helped throughout the week.

The purpose of the Shrine is the veneration of God our Creator and I witnessed first-hand the prayer throughout the week by the pilgrims. The group that came on Wednesday sang songs in Aramaic and some of the women dressed in costumes. They had a wonderful time laughing and dancing.

Please ask Debbie what items are needed for the kitchen as, with any event, supplies are used and need to be replaced.

The Shrine collection jar is now over 3/4 filled with the help of the donations from the Chaldeans. I would like to express my disappointment that the front of the Shrine was unable to be completed this year. We had hoped that the front face would have been finished at the end of this summer but it is over budget. The expected start of the patio and step portion of the Shrine was to be started next spring, but it will have to be put off for a bit.

One thing I did find out was that the patio top is sitting on top of a concrete base. I half-expected the entire patio had to be removed to the dirt and, I am happy to say that is not the case.

We have four groups scheduled for October—we will add more, if God wishes. To anyone who thinks the various groups who pay pilgrimage to the Shrine is not worth the effort involved, I am of a differing opinion. Anyone who approaches God with such respect deserves the effort involved to that end, regardless of the effort involved. God is our creator and any effort to pay Him homage is worth whatever He asks of us. I also think the more than \$5,669 in donations and gift shop purchases received for the few days the Chaldeans were here cannot be ignored; they are a truly generous group.

I know those who volunteered and helped in anyway are happy to hear of these numbers—Lord knows, I am very happy! The restoration account totals \$42,469.84 (this is without the donations from the Chaldeans).
