St. Ephrem, Deacon & Doctor of the Church Feast Day—June 9

On June 9, the Roman Catholic Church honors Saint Ephrem of Syria, a deacon, hermit, and Doctor of the Church who made important contributions to the spirituality and theology of the Christian East during the fourth century. In a 2007, Pope Benedict XVI noted that St. Ephrem became known as the "Harp of the Holy Spirit," for the hymns and writings that sang the praises of God "in an unparalleled way" and "with rare skill."

Ephrem was born in the city of Nisibis in approximately 306. When he received baptism he began to consider the salvation of his soul more seriously. He embraced an ascetic lifestyle under the direction of an elder, who gave him permission to live as a hermit. Ephrem supported himself making sails for ships, while living in a austere manner with few comforts and little food. Eventually ordained as a deacon in Edessa, he was known for his published commentaries and for sermons with urgent and fruitful calls to repentance. Ephrem spent his final years in solitary prayer and writing. Near the end of his life, he briefly left his hermit life to serve the poor and sick during a famine. St. Ephrem of Syria died in June of 373. Soon after his death, he was remembered in a public address by his contemporary Saint Gregory of Nyssa, who closed his remarks by saying of Ephrem: "You are now assisting at the divine altar, and before the Prince of life, with the angels, praising the most holy Trinity."
