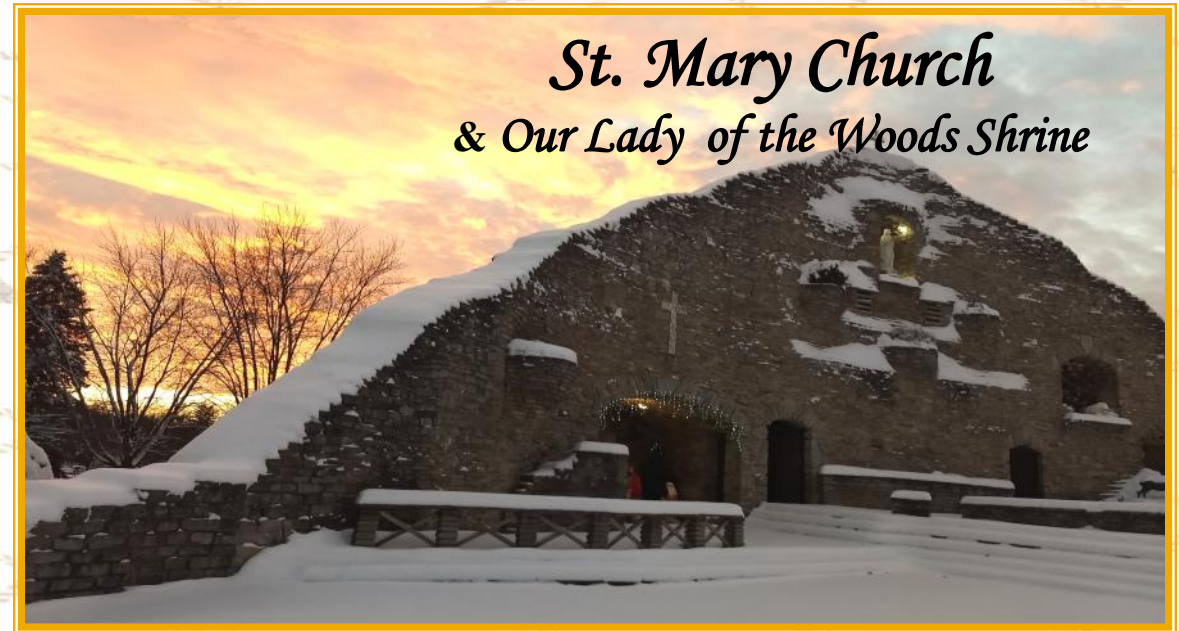

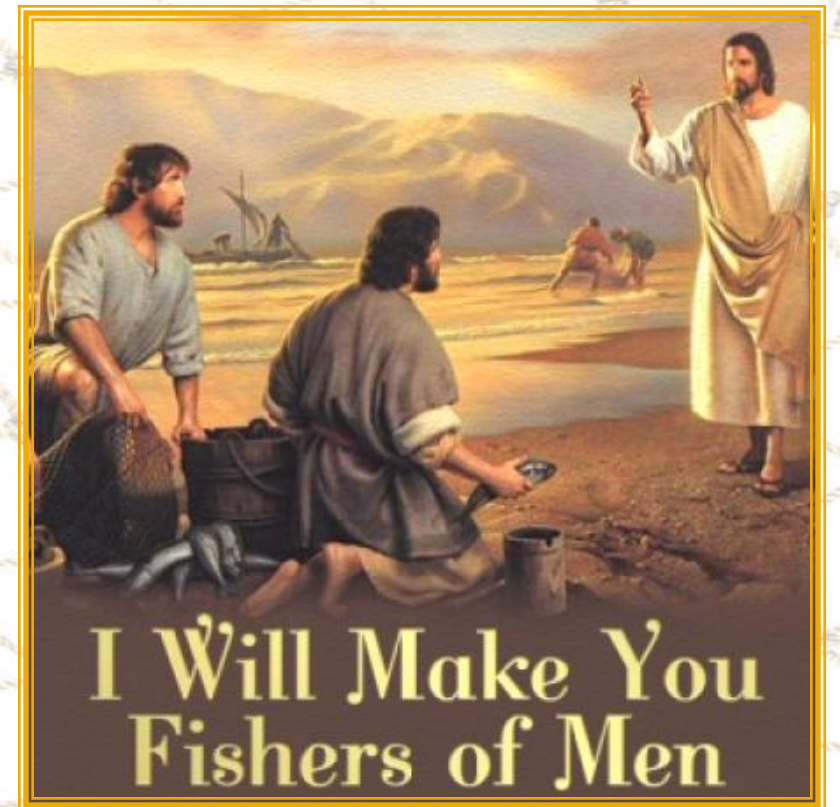

Why We Need Each Other

The sole business of the church is souls. The church is souls in love with God and one another.
