Being a Synodal Church
The practice of living as a synodal Church means:

- The conversations lead to conversion to Christ and commitment to active participation in the mission given by Christ—**Communion**
- The people of God talk with one another and listen to one another about questions that matter—**Participation.**
- The communion exists for a common purpose; mission flows naturally from the experience of communion—**Mission.**

Synodal Requirements

- Addressing the basic questions together.
- Listening to the Holy Spirit.
- Remaining open to the perspectives of other people.
- Progressively maturing the fruits of the Holy Spirit over time.

The Main Question for Consultation
A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." How is this "journeying together" happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together?"

Each of us should give thought and prayer as to how we would answer these questions. In the coming days, each parish around the world will be putting together a committee to discuss this question and gather the thoughts from parishioners. SHRINE CORNER

The Restoration held its meeting to discuss activity for the year, There was a lot of discussion on the patio. It was also mentioned that some minor work had to be done on areas of the face, such as the flower pot niches and the water flow area on the right side of the Shrine.

Frank W. made a presentation on the type of stone—Idaho Quartz—such as size, how much required for coverage and the approximate tonnage needed. Cost for the stone at this juncture was not determined. Frank will finalize those details.

It was determined Jim S. would get three bids from the construction company: 1-Detail face work required with the cost of applying a sealer; 2-A bid on the stone; 3-A bid to do the patio work. In addition, Tom S. brought up if the Parish family could be involved on a volunteer basis to remove the stone. That would be a big savings, much like what was done on the rear grotto roof when volunteers removed and replaced dirt.

At the Shrine scheduling committee meeting, it was discussed to add some dates that could be annual activity dates at the Shrine. The Committee is looking into a May date for Fatima, July 16 date for Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and a September 19 date for Our Lady of LaSalette. These would be in addition to the Feast of Assumption on August 15.

The program for the Silver Rose Prayer Service that has been scheduled by the K of C was turned over to Fr. San for his review and approval. The dates for this event is April 8-10 at our Parish.

Our Lady of LaSalette is the apparition that will be highlighted this year and banner designs were reviewed and approved. A prayer for Our Lady of LaSalette has been approved and will be sent to have a brass plaque made to be placed at the site of the apparition at the Shrine.

A 2022 Special Events and Feast Days pocket-sized calendar was approved and will soon be passed out at weekend Masses. This calendar will list Marian dates and events for all 12 months. As we continue to expand on summer activities, updates will follow. Restoration is now at \$37,661.21—time to get rolling again.
