

The Diocese's Responses to Financial Challenges to Parishes and Schools:

- ◆ CSA target was reduced by 20% for 2020-21
 - ◆ The Priests' Sabbatical Fund support was not billed to parishes this year.
 - ◆ The Seminarian Education Fund Collection, will not take place this August. (*Although, if anyone would still like to donate, it will be gladly accepted.*)
 - ◆ The Bishop's Golf Outing for Seminarians, will not take place this year.
 - ◆ \$300,000 in tuition assistance from the diocese has been approved for Catholic Schools.
- Also, The Northern MI Catholic Foundation (NMF) recently gave \$22,750 to Catholic Schools in northern MI.
