Shrine Corner

The Pieta Grotto is located in the center of the front side of the Shrine. This is where Mary the Mother of God holds her divine son Jesus after his crucifixion.

There are instruments of Jesus's crucifixion placed at each side of the

grotto. The inner part of the Pieta Grotto was designed and constructed in a way to represent the catacombs found below the city of Rome. There are lights hanging from the ceiling along with devotional and votive lamps surrounding the statue of Mary holding Jesus.



These are the Seven Sorrows of Mary that are depicted:

- 1) The Prophecy of Simeon and Anna
- 2) The flight into Egypt
- 3) The finding of the child Jesus in the temple
- 4) The carrying of the cross
- 5) The crucifixion of Jesus
- 6) The retrieval of Jesus' Body and
- 7) The burial of Jesus.

Saying the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of Mary allows us to live a more holy life through the knowledge of our sins and sorrow.
