Saint Juliana of Falconieri Feast Day June 19

Juliana was the only child of a wealthy couple in Florence, Italy, who had built the church of the Annunciation there. She refused to marry and was enrolled as a tertiary with the Servite order; her uncle, St. Alexis Falconieri, was one of the seven founders of the Servites. For nearly 20 years, Juliana lived a devout and useful life at home. In 1304 she formed a community of tertiary sisters who devoted themselves to prayer and good works in Florence. She is considered the foundress of the Servite community of nuns, and was canonized in 1737.

We received donations that totaled \$1,245.00. Unofficially, this moves the Restoration Account to \$53,844.08. Father San notified me that he is taking a vacation on the weekend of June 19. Father Al from Lewiston will be celebrating Mass outside at the Shrine. St. Francis in Lewiston has changed their Saturday Mass schedule to 5:00p.m., so our outdoor Mass outside on that Saturday will be moved to 7:00p.m. Please make note of this time change that will only be in effect for June 19.

Visitation at the Shrine has increased considerably since Memorial Day. During the week, I had the opportunity to stop by and gave a couple tours. Many of the people are visiting the Gift Shop with or without a tour. Why did I put this in the article?
