Shrine Corner

Shrine officially opens May 1. Gift Shop opens 10:00 a.m.-4:00p.m. daily. We received donations of \$850.00 from the letter mailing fundraiser. The Jug was counted and totaled for the month of April \$307.95. The total for the Restoration Account is \$43,340.51.

Last Tuesday we had a session where Shrine issues were discussed. It was determined that on May 9 we will have a procession out to Our Lady of Guadalupe and flowers will be placed at the base of the statue. Details are being finalized. It is my understanding that K of C will be handing out flowers for Mothers’ Day, on the same morning, also. The Grand Knight stated that they have done this Mother Day flower gift for the last 30 years. Don’t forget the K of C started their prayers during the month of May from the book they passed out last weekend and that starts, May 1, and goes daily for the entire month of May. Saturday outdoor Masses at the Shrine will start June 6 and continue until September 4. Masses will be celebrated at 6:00p.m.

July 4<sup>th</sup> and August 15<sup>th</sup> fall on Sunday’s this year and both will have outdoor Mass for the vigils and Sunday mornings. The time for July 4<sup>th</sup> was not set, but August 15 will be at 11:00a.m. Stay tuned for more info on both of these dates.
