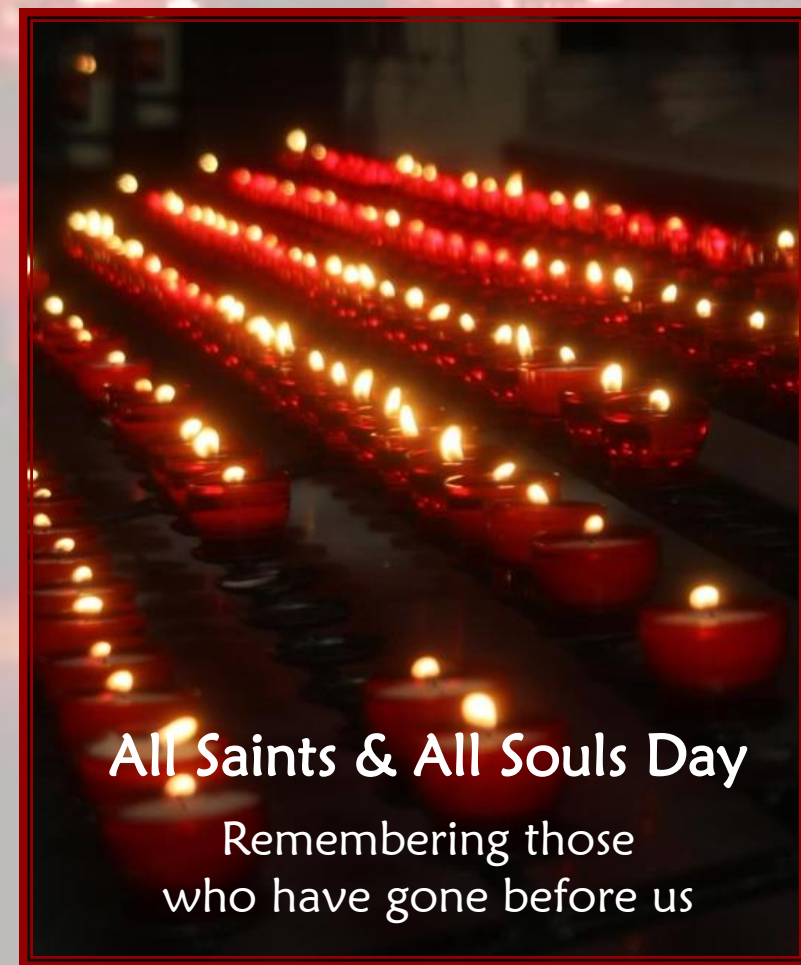

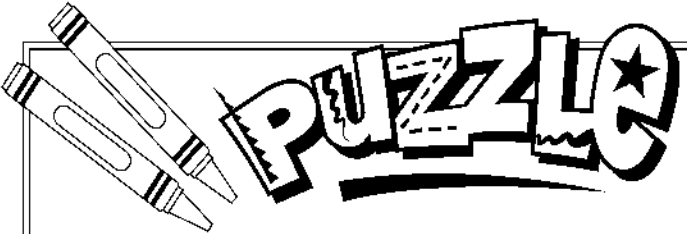

Happiness and joy are frequent themes in the Old Testament book of Psalms.

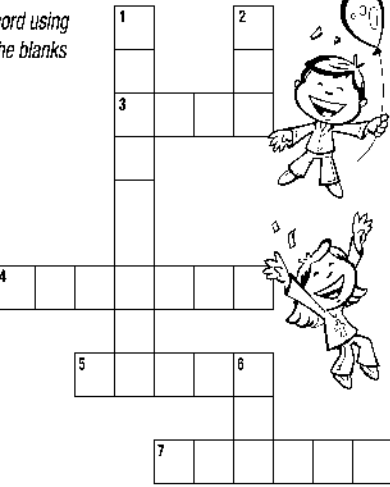
