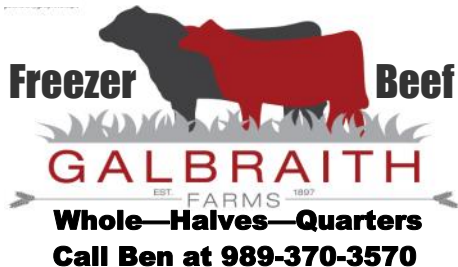
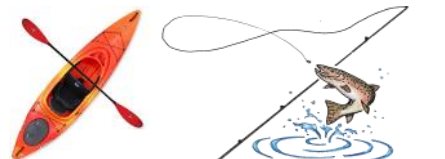

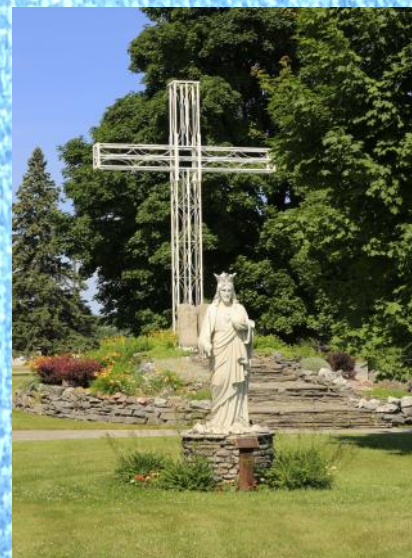

Continued good news. I have just received word that the statue for the Assumption has been adopted. The donor wishes to remain anonymous, which we will honor. Now only St. John and the Stations of the Cross are not adopted. Michele Bowman has determined an estimate on the Stations. She has found out that the Stations are a concrete mold with a smooth resin covering. She has done work on the one that she took with her to determine the bid. The bid for each statue is set at \$1,100.00 per Station for a total of \$14,300.00 for the remaining 13 Stations. She is also looking into the deer which have some issues that are located on the right front. Also a deer by the tubular cross is being evaluated. Those bids will come later when determined.

June 23 we will have a group of Middle Schoolers visiting from Grand Rapids. Dawn D. has been gracious enough to handle this group and the tour will be done by Phoebe.

Father has given me two names for RCIA and I am on the beginning stages of starting the process. I am not going to give the names at this point, but once we get into the program a little deeper, they will become known.
