






Christmas concert will be Sunday, 12/21/25 at 3:00 pm right before the combination Parish and K of C **Christmas Party Potluck**

SHRINE CORNER

Our Lady of Guadalupe

We have \$163,237.06 of our final goal of \$210,000.00.

December 12th is the feast day for Our

Lady of Guadalupe and our parish is celebrating this feast day on Saturday, December 13th.

Mass will be at 4 pm followed by a Taco bar dinner. Here is a little history on Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She appeared to Juan Diego and his uncle, Juan Bernadino, in December 1531 at a place called the Hill of Tepeyac—later known as the Village of Guadalupe. The woman appearing to Juan Diego stated that she was Mary "Mother of the Very True Deity" and told Juan to have a church built at this location in honor of her. He was then to inform the

Archbishop of Mexico City of what had transpired.

Juan wanted no part of this command but did as he was instructed. The bishop's attendants dismissed him and he was happy about this. However, upon returning, Our Lady



of Guadalupe indicated that he was the chosen and needed to return to the bishop. He returned and waited several hours before the bishop received him. He instructed Juan to ask for a sign from this lady of who she was.

Juan Diego was told by Our Lady of Guadalupe to pick some flowers in the freezing winter weather. Finding castellan roses, he gathered them up in his tilma (poncho cape made of burlap), and took them back to the bishop who made him wait again. Upon opening his tilma before the bishop and his attendants, an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe was imprinted on the tilma. The bishop and his attendants immediately fell to their knees upon seeing this beautiful and sacred image.

A small shrine was built at this location. This apparition resulted in the conversion of almost the entire population of Mexico which was 10 million at this time. Juan Diego was canonized a saint on July 31, 2002.
