SHRINE CORNER

I was gone for a couple of weeks and when I returned I
wanted to see how far the work on the Shrine had
progressed. August 1st is fast approaching and that is the
expected date for completion of the patio and the end of
the Restoration.

The top area of the patio and the next two steps appear to
be done waiting for a sealer. The base level and first step
are still a work in progress with stone placement being
developed.

first place. So this work appears to be moving along in
good hands and will be ready.

Personally, I will be glad when all the work will be done
and the Shrine can be totally available to those who visit
or come on a pilgrimage. It has been a long time, but now
the Shrine is in great shape for the next generation.

I just hope that a maintenance program will be put in place
and the Shrine be professionally inspected every so often
so that whoever follows us won't have to start with a
complete re-do. Fix the problems as they occur.

Lastly, Bishop Walsh will soon have surgery and Chris
Supina did have surgery recently for their illnesses. These
are special people so please keep them in your prayers.
