The afternoon of November 9th is our Funraiser for the Detroit Lions versus Washington Commanders football game in Landover, Maryland. The festivities start at 4pm and you are welcome to bring your own chair.

Coincidentally, during this past week on November 3rd we celebrated the feast day of one of our most beloved saints. Yes, it was St. Hubert's feast day. We honor him by the wonderful Bianco Statue from Italy that sits next to the ponds in the front of our shrine. He is also the patron saint of Father Hubert Rakowski, who had the dream of building a shrine in Mio back in 1945.

St. Hubert is the patron saint of hunting, woodsmen, mathematicians and opticians. On a Good Friday, Hubert decided to go hunting rather than attend any church services. While hunting, he came upon a deer, and drew back his arrow to kill the deer, when he saw a crucifix between its antlers. A voice said, *Hubert if you do not turn yourself towards the Lord, you will surely go to hell.* Hubert immediately prostrated himself and asked the Lord what should he do. He was told to go see Bishop Lambert and he will instruct you. In 708 AD, Hubert became the first Bishop of Liege.
