



#### **SHRINE CORNER**

Lanna and I have been downstate this past week and so I don't have an updated report for the Shrine. To be honest, we needed this break after having 8 busses with approximately 450 people visiting the Shrine and utilizing the Parish Hall for refreshments. This is what all the Shrine Restoration effort is about: allowing people to have the opportunity to come and visit and pray at the Shrine. Seeing 6 busses parked back-to-back in front of Church is pretty impressive—returning to the "good old days." The only bad thing is busses don't always come on time and some came after their expected arrival time. In addition I received a phone call from a bus driver who had recommended to other tour groups to stop at Our Lady of the Woods Shrine. We were visited by these companies on Monday when the other busses were here. Wait and see if it results in more bus visits. Richard Troyer placed all 36 pavers in the ground that had been on display in the Parish Hall. Some of the Pavers were placed on the sidewalk, north to the corner where it splits to the front of the Church. The rest were placed going to the south towards Our Lady of Guadalupe. Richard did his usual meticulous job. Keep in mind that we will be receiving an additional 15 pavers on September 28. When they arrive, a picture will be taken of the paver and mailed to the person who made the order. This picture has proven to be popular with the people as I have received numerous phone calls saying "thank you" and asking "where will they be placed?" The crane in front of the Shrine is getting lower and lower, with the peak portion appearing to be finished. That area was a major concern for water entry into the front grotto. If you get a chance, take a look at the peak, walk around to the back and look at the finished work there. Folks, we have come a long way! Think "patio", that is coming up next after the lower portion of the front face is done. There is light at the end of the tunnel. The Statue reconditioning has now been scheduled for the week of May 22 next year. The money for adopted statue reconditioning has been set aside from the structure restoration. There are still statues that are not

adopted and a large number are the smaller statues, plaques, etc. So you might want to take a look at the brochure to see if you might want to adopt one as a Christmas gift. We can still add statues for reconditioning until March 1. Restoration received \$2,063.00 and now totals \$92,991.21.
