

Many people don't consider the choir part of the Shrine, but I disagree. The choir is an integral part of every parish event and We have \$167,602.31 of our final goal of \$210,000.00.

every Mass that is held outside. So, I am going to give my thoughts on the choir for the last 17 years.

Two members— Michele Horger and Mary Schrock— sung at Mass as well as Elizabeth (Shea) Kachiros (before the birth of the children) and Tena Troyer. Basically, it was a small contingent of a few parishioners and never a large ensemble of musicians.

In the beginning, the organ was played by a lady from Lewiston, then from a non-Catholic lady who only came on Sundays. Later, Luke Farhat played the guitar. Then we had parishioner Marge Beale play part-time and, eventually, the organ stopped. No organists were found in or out of the parish.

Then things changed. Michele Horger took the bull by-the-horns and gradually the choir started to grow. We went from one to sometimes ten singers at Mass. We searched for an organist and there was none to be found. Here is where God amazed us! Luke and Marisa Farhat also sang in the choir in Grayling. Ellen Thompson, the organist there, had some old floppy discs with recorded music on them. Marisa knew here in Mio that we had the same organ—so they were donated to us. Ellen just couldn't throw them away, thank the Lord! This is where Delores McArdle stepped up to the plate and learned how to play the discs so that music accompanied the singers. Kris Babcock has also jumped in when needed.

Michele has not only upgraded our choir but she allows other choir members to come to the forefront and take leadership roles by doing some of the solo pieces such as the Responsorial Psalms. I can't imagine how difficult that would be to put yourself at center stage.

I have told Michele several times that my favorite song is the AVE MARIA, without accompaniment. When she sings this song, you can hear a pin drop in the Church. Michele deserves a lot of credit for the recruitment of quality parishioners who have joined the choir. The best part is that she is developing young people.

I know Michele has an upcoming 2nd annual Christmas Concert coming up on the 21st for the parish at 3pm and I thought it was an appropriate time for this piece. When I told Michele I was going to do an insert, she said don't forget to give credit to Delores McArdle because she is an important part of the success of our choir.

So many people do so many things here at St. Mary/OLWS. This is another reason why I am proud to be a member in this Parish Family. I have seen God work here and He does good work!
