**Chippie Doesn't Sing Much Anymore**  
*A woman was cleaning the bottom of the cage of her parakeet, Chippie with a canister vacuum cleaner. When the telephone rang, she turned her head to pick it up, continuing to vacuum the cage as she said, "Hello," into the phone. Suddenly Chippie let out a squawk and was sucked into the vacuum. Immediately she put down the phone, ripped open the vacuum bag, and found Chippie in there, stunned but still alive. Since the bird was covered with dust and dirt, she grabbed it, ran it into the bathroom, and held the bird under the water to clean it off. When finished she turned on her hair dryer and held the bird in front of the blast of air to dry him off. The next day, the friend who had been on the phone called to ask the woman how Chippie was doing. She said, "Well, Chippie doesn't sing much anymore, he just sort of sits quietly and stares."*



Today's Gospel tells us that's what happened to the apostles. They all were traumatized by the arrest and crucifixion of their master. Then they were amazed but also bewildered by his post-Resurrection appearances and his command to prepare for the coming of his Holy Spirit. Some of us can identify with Chippie and the apostles. Life has sucked us up, thrown cold water on us, and blown us away. Somewhere in the trauma, we have lost our song. Hence, we, too, need the daily anointing of the Holy Spirit to keep us singing.  
Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. The Paschal mystery -- the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus -- culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith.  
You could say, Pentecost is the birthday of the Church Jesus established nearly 2,000 years ago. Today's Scripture readings remind us that Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of today's readings is that the gift of the Holy Spirit should inspire recipients to action and to share the good news of this gift with others.
