

SHRINE CORNER

Just because we have entered Fall does not mean the Shrine visitation has stopped. We will be busy into mid-November. I think Father San has been spreading the word around downstate as some of the visitors from that area continue to contact us for tours.

On October 2nd, a Doctor with some family members visited from downstate and were given a tour with our usual hospitality.

October 10th, Father Maher from Saginaw Valley State University is bringing a group of college students for Mass, lunch and a tour. They are talking about going kayaking afterwards. Hope the weather is good.

November 3rd, a bus from downstate will arrive with 30 -50 senior citizens for Rosary, Mass, lunch and tour. There will be another group of college students from Aquinas College in Grand Rapids on November 6-7. One thing we have learned is that visitation at the Shrine has a large attendance near or after the supper hour. The Gift Shop closes at 4 p.m. and we usually lock up the gates to the grottos at or near 7:00 p.m. This will have to be discussed in future Shrine meetings to accommodate

our visitors who come later in the day between Memorial Day to Labor Day. 36 pavers have been placed in the ground and I am cur-

rently updating the map and location of each. On October 4th, 26 more pavers will arrive.

For those that visit the Shrine, we will be removing the glass globes in the grottos and in the Our Lady of Czestochowa opening. Why? When freezing weather arrives and the candles get lit, the heat of the flame breaks the glass. The glass globes are not cheap and even though we buy some each year, they need to be protected. Last year, we had a frost by this time.

This is the time of the year when the leaves start dropping and Richard keeps the leaves picked up with his lawn bagger, but the wind keeps blowing the leaves into the grottos, especially the Czestochowa opening. So if you are bored, you can always ask Richard for a broom and garbage bag and these areas could be swept to rid them of the leaf build-up. This is a little thing, but it is a big help!

Lastly, we emptied the Jug in the Narthex last Sunday and it totaled \$790.00—by far the most we have ever received from the Jug in a month. The Chaldeans during their visit probably helped that amount to grow—they are extremely generous. The Restoration amount now totals \$94,473.29 and the statue reconditioning amount from the Adopt-a-Statue totals \$17,384.01.
